#### **Work Package 2**

**Aim:** Capture participants' intersectional place experiences on inclusive and exclusionary community settings in urban, rural and remote physical places and virtual spaces

**Activity:** Life course interview schedules; production of AGOL protocol and platform; use of Place Standards Tool; co-development of Sociograms to map Social Networks and place

**Output:** Life course autobiographical stories; textual and visual story maps; linking Social Network Sociograms to place

#### **Work Package 3**

**Aim:** Integrate cohort-specific findings from WP2 for providing holistic, intersectional understandings of healthy, active and inclusive ageing communities in a single analytical space

**Activity:** Co-development of actions and recommendations through the shared process of interpretation and agreement using Data Synthesis Workshops, Deliberative Dialogue Sessions

**Output:** Share live stories; multiple layers of analysis; develop evidence for new and further funding bids

#### **Work Package 4**

**Aim:** Integrate and prioritise participants' intersectional life-stories as stimuli for visioning healthy, active and inclusive future possibilities by listening to participants' stories and using this material to guide discussions on evidence into practice and possible futures

**Activity:** Understanding dialogic and deliberative communication to improve public engagement work, and ways to develop collective capacity to address complex public issues; listening for Direction events; evidence into Practice workshops; co-creation and Pre-testing of Potential Solutions

**Output:** Visioning solutions; co-creating ideas for potential solutions to issues identified

**Aim:** Facilitate mobilisation of co-produced knowledge to diverse public, sectoral and academic spheres, underpinned by community engagement and intervention development fore-fronted by local perspectives and involvement in all research stages

#### Development of research skills for researchers and co-researchers

International awareness of marginalised voices raised via International Reference Group involvement

Co-developed Story maps and individual stories of belonging that give voice to marginalised groups as a tool of empowerment

Enablement of social inclusion through participatory and creative mechanisms

Provision of interactive spaces for respectful and open dialogue to facilitate a range of voices to be included, articulated and integrated into discussions and shared

Shared decision making that feeds into knowledge translation and contributed to shared responsibility

Raising of consciousness of issues encountered and expression participants' voices

Development of solutions to barriers and strengthening facilitators

Sharing of diverse bases by creating space to discuss synthesis results at deliberative dialogue sessions

Allow for active listening of diverse perspectives

Facilitation of shared learning to inform actions for change towards inclusive communities, and enable a sense of belonging and flourishing to occur

Raised awareness of lived experience of barriers and facilitators to community inclusion across stakeholders

Stimulation of policy debate in stakeholder groups/sectors

Professional planning and policy is informed

Strategic dissemination across multiple channels and formats raises awareness of barriers to social inclusion

# Individual level: Middle- to older-aged people with LD and LGBT+ people

Increased social and community inclusion of people with Learning Disabilities and LGBT+ people

Development of skills and knowledge for members of advisory groups and co-researchers through:

- Participation in advisory groups
- Experience in designing and taking part in research

Increased awareness of the lived experiences of both groups for those involved in the project and the general public through:

- Shared experiences and conversations
- Presentations and conference attendance

#### Community level: Local service providers
